Surgeries may begin in late summer with 1-2 a month. Most insurance will support surgeries. "primary care, hormone therapy and mental health support, as well as chest and facial reconstruction procedures. Later this summer, as part of the comprehensive center, the hospital will begin genital surgery for men transitioning," and what they mean are orchiectomies and related surgeries for vaginoplasty. #nonbinary Have to be over 18 and "lived for 12 months or longer in their new gender."
